BACKGROUND

- <u>February 2018</u>: Jonathan Updike, Emily Beagle, Allison Connell, Ty McNamee, Levi Higgs, and Megan Jenkins wrote an op-ed in the Casper Star-Tribune calling for more dialogue with generations due to inherit Wyoming's future
- March 2018: Jerimiah Rieman, Director of ENDOW, reached out to Jonathan Updike, who recruited the other op-ed authors and more to develop the dialogue with next generations
- April 2018: Initial group submitted ENDOW: ENGAGE proposal for consideration
- June 9, 2018: ENDOW: ENGAGE Summit gathers feedback through in-person and remote participation of its target audience, presents preliminary data, and gathers ENGAGE Council nominations
- <u>June 23, 2018</u>: ENDOW: ENGAGE submits its general trends/recommendations for ENDOW's Final Recommendations Report

POST-SUMMIT OUTCOMES

- The ENGAGE Council will:
 - Deliver ENGAGE Summit Recommendations to ENDOW Executive Council by June 23 for inclusion in the ENDOW Final Recommendations Report,
 - Select ENGAGE Councilmembers for the July 1, 2018– June 30, 2019 term,
 - Prepare and submit ENGAGE's four-year strategic plan to the ENDOW Executive Council by November 1st, 2018, and
 - Prepare and submit a gubernatorial administration transition plan by November 15th, 2018.

ENDOW EXECUTIVE COUNCIL REPRESENTATION

- The Op-Ed and ENDOW: ENGAGE had proposed representation now updated to include:
 - Two (2) non-residents with demonstrated Wyoming ties and executive level experience,
 - Two (2) non-students residing and employed in Wyoming between 16-35 years old,
 - One (1) student of higher education in Wyoming (selected on a rotating basis between the University of Wyoming, Casper College, Northwest College, Northern Wyoming Community College District, Eastern Wyoming College, Laramie County Community College, Western Wyoming Community College, and Central Wyoming College),
 - One (1) student enrolled in a Wyoming high school, and
 - President (1) of the ENGAGE Council
- All would be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate for two year terms.
